All trot work may be ridden sitting or rising, unless stated.

Arena 20 x 60m Average time including comments 10 min

	TEST
A	Enter in working trot
X	Halt thru the walk or trot, salute (3sec minimum immobility). Proceed working trot rising
C	Track to the left
S-I	Half Circle left 10M
I-R	Half Circle right 10M
A	Down centerline
L	Leg yield left to H
M-X-K	Lengthen stride in the trot rising
K	Working trot
A	Down centerline
L	Leg yield right to M
Between C & H	Medium walk
H to B	Free walk
B to E	Half circle 20M medium walk
S	Working trot
Between H & C	Working canter right lead
R	Circle right 15M
R - F	Lengthen stride in the canter
Between F & A	Develop working canter
K to R	Change rein with a change of lead thru the trot near the centerline
S	Circle left 15M working canter
S to K	Lengthen stride in the canter
Between K & A	Develop working canter
Between A & F	Develop working trot
P to H	Lengthen stride in trot
H	Working trot
B	Circle right 20M, working trot rising allowing the horse to stretch forward and downward
A	Down centerline
X	Halt thru walk or trot, salute (3 sec. immobility)

Leave arena at A at a walk on a long rein



**The purpose is to produce young horses with elastic natural gaits, trained according to the training scale, which show ability to progress and succeed in the higher levels of dressage.**

ASSESSMENT OF INDIVIDUAL TASKS	COMMENTARY	MARK
<b>Trot</b> Rhythm, looseness, suppleness, swinging back, elasticity, impulsion, ability to bend the joints of the hindquarters		
<b>Walk</b> Rhythm, relaxation, activity, ground cover		
<b>Canter</b> Rhythm, looseness, suppleness, elasticity, natural balance, uphill tendency, ability to bend the joints of the hindquarters		
<b>Submission</b> Standard of training on basis of "Training Scale" (suppleness, contact, straightness). Obedience, focus, and responsiveness to the aids of the rider. Transitions within the paces.		
<b>General Impression</b> Potential as dressage horse demonstrating the quality and the skills to enable it to progress up the levels.		
<b>TOTAL MARKS</b>		
Divided by 5 = Total Score		
<b>Errors</b> For Prospect Incentive test, the deduction for an error shall be: First Error - 5% from the total score received Second Error - 1% from the total score received Third Error - Elimination
