Trot Rhythm, looseness, suppleness, swinging back, elasticity, impulsion, ability to bend the joints of the hindquarters		
Walk Rhythm, relaxation, activity, ground cover		
Canter Rhythm, looseness, suppleness, elasticity, natural balance, uphill tendency, ability to bend the joints of the hindquarters		
Submission Standard of training on basis of "Training Scale" (suppleness, contact, straightness). Obedience, focus, and responsiveness to the aids of the rider. Transitions within the paces.		
General Impression Potential as dressage horse demonstrating the quality and the skills to enable it to progress up the levels.
