35	contact should be rewarded and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of					
36	the horse while performing the maneuver requirements and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations.					
37	The purpose of the ranch riding class is to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a					
38	means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse should reflect the versatility, attitude and					
39	movement of a working ranch horse riding outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, relaxed,					
40	quiet, soft and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious					
41	lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse can be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein without					
42	requiring undue restraint, but not shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the ranch					
43	riding horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as the quality of the movement are of					
44	primary considerations. The ideal ranch riding horse should have a natural head carriage at each gait. For rules regarding
