22 Whereas, The Youth Committee and the Education and Evaluation Commission have given their full support of a resolution regarding lead changes in Horsemanship; Therefore, Be It
25 Resolved, That USEF AR252.4 be amended by striking out and inserting the following:
26 Demonstrate a simple change of lead. (In a simple change of lead, the horse is brought back to a walk or jog and restarted into the lope on the opposite lead.) ... lead change, simple or flying. Judge may not designate type of change. (A simple lead change is performed through the walk or jog within three strides. Flying changes should be simultaneous front and rear. All changes should be smooth and timely.)
